Matthew Compton—Tins and Coppers Divisions

Matthew, a native of Colorado Springs, has been composing, arranging, and conducting music for handbells since 2007, when he was in the seventh grade. He had his first composition published at the age of 15, making him one of the youngest ever published handbell composers. Since then he has had numerous compositions and arrangements published. Matthew's music has been selected for the repertoire of regional and national handbell festivals, including Distinctly Bronze East and West, and the International Handbell Symposium.

Matthew is a graduate of Concordia University Wisconsin with a degree in music—focusing on composition and conducting. During his time at Concordia, he rang with the Alleluia Ringers, a touring handbell choir; sang with Kammerchor, a touring vocal choir; started a student handbell choir to perform at an annual campus event; and was the handbell director at a local church.

Since January 2017 he has been the artistic director/conductor of Bells of the Cascades and the Director of Music Ministries at Salmon Creek United Methodist Church



Sondra Tucker—Massed Choirs and Bronze Conference Choir

Sondra lives in Memphis, Tennessee with her husband of 35 years. They have a daughter and two granddaughters in Denver, and a son and his wife in Memphis. Sondra is a retired organist/choirmaster, but keeps busy subbing for other organist colleagues, except for Sundays when her bell choir, the Holy Communion Ringers of Holy Communion Episcopal Church, ring.

She serves as Past Chair and Webmaster of Area 6, and heads the West Tennessee Handbell Association, which puts on a yearly festival in early March. Sondra has been clinician for local and Area festivals and denominational conferences all over the country.

Her handbell music is in the catalogs of all leading handbell publishers, and she regularly completes commissions for church and community groups. She is handbell editor for Alfred Handbell, and also writes and self-publishes flute ensemble music and weird handbell music that doesn't fit the publishing niche. The Tuckers foster Shelties, and have three of our own, whom they refer to as the Wayward Dogs. They like to ride their Harleys when the weather is nice and are Houston Astros fanatics.

Certification Classes

Handbell Techniques 1 — The basics examines basic handbell and handchime ringing and damping techniques, with an emphasis on ergonomic principles and sound production.

Conducting 1 -Review the basics examines the components of conducting, execution of metrical patterns, and the means by which to communicate all the musical indicators contained in the score in a clear, concise, and understandable manner. Repertoire range: Level 1 to 3. Prerequisite—conducting experience
